Nicholas Karel Subagyo (IE 2021)

1st Place Men's 1500m freestyle & 3rd Place Men's 800m freestyle

Singapore National Age Group (SNAG 2023) 20th Mar 2023, OCBC Aquatic Centre Singapore, Singapore

Karel was selected as a representative of Indonesia to join the Singapore National Age Group (SNAG 2023) swimming competition from March 14th - March 22nd, 2023. SNAG is an international swimming competition for junior and seniors' swimmers that is affiliated with the Singapore Swimming Association.

In this competition, he succesfully earned 2 awards, which included a 1^{st} Place in the men's 1500m freestyle with a time of 16 mins, and 3^{rd} Place in the men's 800m with a time 8 mins and 20 seconds.

Decky and Ajeng won Third Place as the best Digital Start-Up Business in the 10th Ambassador of Business Edupreneur 2022 competition. It is the annual competition that was conducted by Universitas Pendidikan Indonesia (UPI) to explore and find potential young entrepreneurs who can run and create a sustainable business. In this competition, Decky and Ajeng created "BeassisKu", an online application to provide information about university scholarships for high school students, which gained them the Third Place Award.



Selfi Nurcholifah (ACC 2019) Selected Awardee and Top Policy Initiator Young ASEAN Leaders Policy Initiative 2023 (YALPI 2023) 28 Dec 2022, Online

YALPI 2023 is an international forum that aims to gather and empower youth to initiate solutions for solving current social issues from the bottom-up. In this event, participants are required to discuss and create policy in response with the given theme, Rethinking Post-COVID-19 in ASEAN: An Equitable and Resilient Socio-Economic Recovery, that later will be implemented in the Southeast Asian region. Moreover, her idea to recommend both government and policy makers support active learning, develop infrastructure in rural areas, and consider the digitalization of untapped areas in the banking sector earned her one of the 60 awards. As one of the awardees, Selfie participated in six days of conferences at Chulalongkorn University to learn about digital inclusion, food security, and policy design. Moreover, she was nominated as the top policy initiator.

Winner of ICStar Hackathon 2022 ICStar Hackathon 2022 15 Dec 2022, Online Competition

ICStar Hackathon 2022 is an International IT competition consisting of 3 phases that connect universities and industries by utilizing the latest technology trends as the center of competition. Aaron had been selected as one of the top 78 students that were selected as the participants in ICStar Hackathon 2022 among the 900+ participants around Indonesia, Malaysia, and South Africa on September 18th. As one of the participants, he had the opportunity to join UIPat's training to learn about Robotic Automation Training, Ousystem, and TvExtract for 1 month to ease them into doing the use case. Afterwards, Aaron and his team provided their solution about the Sourcing Problem in Indosat Ooredoo Hutchison (IOH). The use case objective was to create a system that minimized the sourcing time. Their idea to create a Candidate Sourcing Robot using the combination of RPA and Al was chosen the winner after the final showcase, and they obtained a 200-million-rupiah prize. Aaron mentioned that his success during the competition was also due to the meaningful feedback from our CS student, Jauharul Arifin (2019).

Indonesia Open Aquatic Championship (IOAC) is a yearly national-level competition held in GBK Aquatic Center, Senayan, Jakarta. It consisted of four aquatic sport disciplines, including swimming, artistic swimming, diving, and water polo. The swimming competition was held on 12-15 December. Karel, representing JAQ Aquatics, gained 4 gold (Men's 200, 400, 800, and 1500 m freestyle, 2 silver (Men's 100m Freestyle and 200 m Individual Medley) and 2 bronze medals (Men's 50 m Freestyle and 200m Backstroke). Overall, Karel become the best senior male's swimmer.

INSITEF 2022 is the third mechanical joint symposium among seven universities in Indonesia. The symposium aims to provide a forum to share ideas, knowledge, research, and ongoing relevant initiatives about several topics in ME, including energy conversion, renewable energy, materials, manufacturing, solid mechanics, and control and automation. Azka, Amartya and Azhari conducted research about the effect of annealing on Mechanical Properties of Fused Deposition Modeling 3D Printed Polylactic Acid (PLA). The research aims to improve the tensile properties of the PLA and determine the most optimized parameters (time and temperature) based on tensile test result. In this conference, Azka become the best presenter of the conference representing SU and his team.

The research aimed to resolve the problem related to complex machine operation and high machine cost. From this research, Dzulkifly was invited to represent his team to present their research about fluid, solid mechanic, and structural integrity. His amazing presentation made him to be the best presenter in INSITEF 2022.
