On behalf of the President of Sampoerna University:

Dear Members of the University Council:

I hope all of you are doing well.

During the summer break, I wanted to provide a couple of quick updates and request your review and approval of the SU operating budget for AY 25/26. In terms of updates, we hosted Dr. Stephen Healey, the Chair of the NECHE Visiting Team, in late May. Dr. Healey will lead the team that will conduct our initial accreditation visit in November of this year. Although an informal visit, he was very impressed with the institution and the faculty, staff and students. This cannot help but positively influence his preliminary discussions with the team when they assemble later this year.

In early June, we hosted another U.S. accreditation team from the Southern Association. This visit was to review SU as a host of Keiser University's International Center (for lower-division and associate degrees). The team gave us the highest possible outcome—no recommendations.

The attached budget was developed under challenging circumstances. The yield from our recruiting efforts in 24/25 was disappointing. We had targeted approximately 150 new students to begin in Fall 2025, but we estimate that the actual number will be closer to 125. The resulting drop in revenue forced us to layoff a number of non-instructional staff. In the wake of our recruiting problems, our Vice Rector for Enrollment Services (and head of recruiting) resigned last month. We are reorganizing recruiting and implementing a more aggressive, targeted approach for AY 26/27.

Some highlights from the budget:

- A decline in fee-paying and sponsored students has negatively impacted revenue projections. Some silver lining is that almost 80% of our students, however, are fee-paying.
- Non-instructional cuts and efficiencies will further reduce our deficit as reflected in audit reports by another \$500,000. Our deficit has been reduced by \$1,800,000 over the last four years.
- Similarly, the subsidy required from the Foundation has also been reduced an additional \$100,000. This subsidy has been reduced over \$2,100,000 over the last four years.

Organizational changes, the opening of the MBA, and a more targeted, focused recruiting campaign for next year provide optimism that SU will be able to accelerate its path toward financial sustainability. We are also hopeful that the "halo effect" of receiving U.S. accreditation early in 2026 will also provide a significant boost to next year's enrollment.

We respectfully request your approval of next year's operating budget. Please let us know if you have any questions or comments. I have copied our CFO, Bu Ajeng, who can also reply to your questions.

Apologies for the delay in responding; I've been on the move! Just two weeks ago I began a new position as Vice Provost (and Professor) at Texas State University. I'm a little behind on correspondence because of all the packing and unpacking, but it's great to be back in Texas.

What I see in the numbers (and Marshall's summary) is fewer students, but a larger proportion of fee-paying students. I agree that this suggests even modest growth as a result of US accreditation and the roll out of the MBA program should be very good news, as long as costs do not rise as well.

In thinking the recruiting challenge through, I wish I understood the Indonesian higher education context better. These kinds of enrollment-driven struggles have become very common at traditional US universities, but most have not reduced costs or their endowment draw in ways that are as responsive as the proposal we've been asked to consider. Perhaps others can fill in the gaps on how enrollments more broadly are looking in Indonesia.

Having said all of that, I approve the budget proposal, and look forward to our discussion of this and other topics at our next meeting.

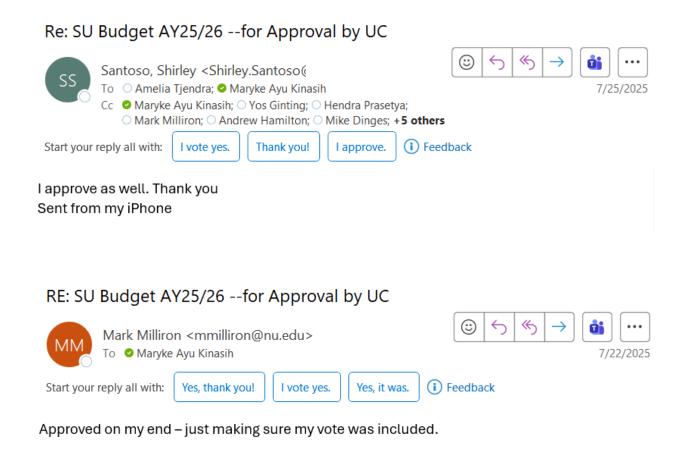

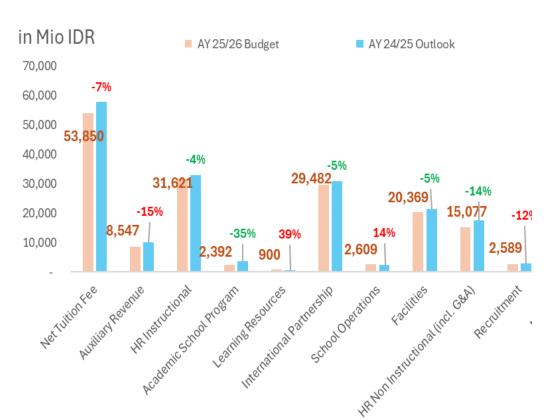

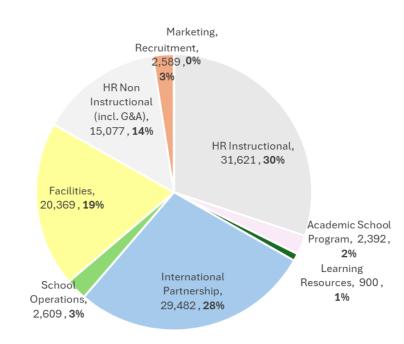
